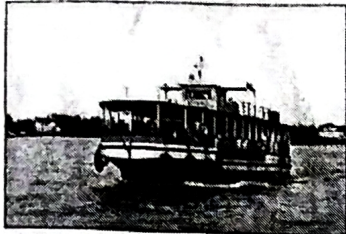

Electric ferry on Hooghly: Official

Calcutta: Ferry services on the Hooghly, now powered by diesel, will go electric, a senior state government official said on Tuesday.
The transport department has signed a contract with Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers (GRSE) to design a prototype of electric ferries, which are to be delivered soon.
The managing director of the West Bengal Transport Corporation, Rajanir Singh Kapur, told a workshop that the corporation had received orders for electric ferries with GRSE and they would be deployed on the Hooghly once the prototype passed an evaluation. "We are going to have electric mobility in the waterways in the next few months," Kapur said.
The zero-emission electric ferry will be powered by a 210 kWh liquid-cooled energy storage solution and have solar panels mounted on the roof. It will be 24 metres long with an aluminium catamaran hull and twin propellers. Its piercing hull design will allow an operating speed of 8 km/h (around 15kmph) and a maximum of 19 km/h (around 18kmph).
Ferry services along the Hooghly are a lifeline for thousands of commuters and there is tremendous scope for improvement.
The vessels that operate now have diesel engines and cause severe pollution, environmentalists have said.
Once the prototype of the green ferry completes trials successfully, more vessels can be ordered to replace the entire fleet of diesel-powered ferries, a senior state official said.
The workshop was conducted by the British deputy high commissioner along with the West Bengal Council of Technical & Vocational Education and Skill Development.

According to a source, GRSE's in-house design team has completed work on such a vessel and it will be constructed following the rules of the classification society for such a class of passenger vessels.
The lead for the electric ferry boat was laid out in January. Kapur said "Decarbonising the waterway transport is part of the green project for the transport sector. It will revolutionise the water transport system in this region and support the country's efforts to reduce its emissions and carbon footprint, changing the lives of the people in the city."

Rs 96,000 lost while booking hotel room

Calcutta: A woman who was planning a family vacation came across a phone number during a Google search that was shown to be a number of a hotel in Paris and was duped into clicking a link sent to her on WhatsApp.
The central Calcutta resident lost Rs 96,000, debited from her account within moments of clicking the link, police said.
"On dialling the number, thinking it was that of the hotel, she was told to make an advance payment of Rs 12,000 for booking a room. She did as asked, but then the person over the phone, who claimed to be the manager of the hotel, said the transfer was not reflecting in the hotel's account because of some technical reason," said an officer of the cybercrime cell of the central division of the city police.
The woman had sent the money to a UPI number that was shared with her through a WhatsApp message.
The fraudster called the woman back saying they were going to send a link to her phone through which she was asked to make the payment again. She was told the amount would be adjusted if the earlier payment went through," the officer said.
The woman apparently clicked the link and soon found Rs 12,000 had been debited from her account.
Raising the fraud, she reported the matter to Muchpran police station and the cybercrime cell of the central division. The cell started an investigation and contacted the victim's bank. The money was found to have been transferred to an account in a branch in Uttar Pradesh, the police said.

3 dead in bus-car crash in Howrah

Calcutta: Three persons travelling in a car were killed after a government bus hit it on NH 16 at Howrah in a head-on collision on Tuesday morning.
The car was reduced to a mangled mass and police had to bring in a gas cutter to slice it up and bring out the dead.
The deceased, all in their early 30s, have been identified as Dipak Pandit of Chandernagore in West Midnapore, Pritam Chakravarty of Kowal in the same district and Sanjit Malhotra of Lalghat in Jhargram.
The car was headed towards Calcutta within the bus was travelling at a high speed towards Digha from Lalba in North 24 Parganas, the police said.
Around 8.15 am, the driver of the Hyundai car, however lost control and veered towards the Kolaghat-bound lane of the highway and came in front of the bus that was speeding down the highway, a senior police officer. "All of them died on the spot. We shifted the bodies and a few injured bus passengers to Ba-

son Rural Hospital."
After reaching the accident site, the police spent over an hour and a half despoiling the bus from the car before towing it away and then slicing up parts of the car's front portion using a gas cutter.
Gradually, the bodies were retrieved from the car one after another with the help of a section of local residents and shopkeepers before they were sent to a hospital nearby in an ambulance.
The area was cordoned off to facilitate rescue operations facing traffic to move slowly down the spot where the collision occurred.
"We have found some documents from the car. The passengers were headed for Calcutta, it appeared," the officer said.

Wear helmets properly, say neurosurgeons

Calcutta: It is vital to wear a helmet while riding a two-wheeler and it is equally important to wear it properly, said some neurosurgeons who were on roads to create awareness about the utility of a helmet on the occasion of World Head Injury Awareness Day on Monday.
Members of the Association of Neurosurgeons of Eastern India and Park Clinic, in collaboration with Calcutta traffic police, carried out the awareness drive on how to wear a helmet to the city.

The motto of today's event was to lay emphasis on the importance of wearing helmets properly. It is extremely important to fasten the chin strap properly so that in case of a crash, the helmet does not come off. Many riders do not understand that," said neurosurgeon Sandip Chatterjee.
According to the city police, 2,60,568 two-wheeler riders were prosecuted for riding without a helmet in 2021.
In all, 21,014 cases of rash driving were reported in Calcutta in 2021 and as many as 27,118 of them involved two-wheelers.
A senior officer of the traffic police department said two-wheeler riders without helmets are at risk of suffering serious head injuries. In 2021, 68 of the 190 road accident victims in Calcutta were riding two-wheelers, the police said.
